General Orders No. 1

2020-2021 Series

- Proof of Eligibility Requirements for Officers:** All Posts & Districts should be reminded of the provisions of Section 216 &, 416 of the Manual of Procedures that officers, elected and appointed, shall not be installed or assume the duties of their office until proof of eligibility has been submitted to the respective Adjutant and properly reviewed.
- Pursuant to Article V, Sec 3 of the Department of Oklahoma, Veterans of Foreign Wars By-Laws,** "A delegate registration fee established by the Council of Administration will be paid by each Post for every delegate to which it is entitled and by others authorized to cast a vote as defined by the National By-Laws. This fee may be increased/decreased at each succeeding convention by the Council of Administration. Said fees shall be paid to the State Quartermaster 15 days prior to the opening session of the Department Convention. Anyone wanting to register after this date will be assessed an additional fee of \$1.00 for each delegate registered. Post delegate fees are due and payable regardless of convention attendance. Post that do not pay prior to the convention will be assessed the delegate fees at the plus \$1.00 rate."

First of all, I hope this finds all of you and your family healthy and well. If not, I pray for a speedy recovery. Well, here we are on the first day of a new administrative year! I want to thank our Immediate Past State Commander Darryl Mabry for all his hard work not only this past year, but also for his time coming up the chairs and all he has done to support the VFW, Auxiliary and Cooties. So, hats off to you, Darryl! Congratulations on a great year, even with COVID-19 hampering the last half of it!

On June 20th, 2020, the Department held its 99th Annual Convention at which I was humbled and honored to be elected your State Commander. I want to thank each and every one of you for the support you have given me as I climbed up through the chairs these past five years. I want you to know that you come first this year. This year will not be about one individual, Post, District or the Department. This year is about you, the member, who makes this organization so great. We are going to focus on you and what we can do to make your membership worth keeping and coming back for.

All of this begins with you. We are going to be open to all ideas that will grow and strengthen our Department this year. We are going to have to be creative in what we do this year as we continue to face the unprecedented challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic. That means that we must think outside of the box when it comes to promoting our programs and growing our membership. That also means finding ways to stay in contact with our membership and checking in on them from time to time. We are our own best support system, but it requires ALL of us to take part in it.

Our Membership Chair, State Surgeon Stacy Reddig is working with our Membership Retention Chair Robbi Clark to formulate an aggressive membership program. It is going to be a comprehensive design that will utilize grassroots efforts as well as support at all levels. From what I have seen of it so far, it looks to be a great program. Along those lines, State Officers as well as the District Officers are aware of the membership goal for this year and now I am passing that along to you: **100% BY DECEMBER 31ST, 2020 110% BY JUNE 30TH, 2021.** That means we are looking to add 1,160 members to our ranks by the end of the administrative year. This is an extremely aggressive goal, but I know that we can pull up our bootstraps and accomplish anything, so long as we put our mind to it. Our Department Auxiliary President Steven Hodge and I have created a competition for everyone to participate in. The VFW member that recruits the most for the Auxiliary and the Auxiliary member that recruits the most for the VFW will both receive awards at the next convention. I am also announcing my Commander's Challenge for the year: The first post and District to reach 110% will receive a \$100 reward should they make it prior to 31 Dec 2020. Each post or District that makes it after the first one but prior to 31 Dec 2020 will receive a \$50 reward. Again, it begins with you.

For our Programs, we have a very enthusiastic Chair in our District 14 and Post 5263 Commander Erica Wilson-Traxler. She is formulating a comprehensive agenda for making sure we continue the trend of increasing the participation in every one of our programs. We know that there will be a rough road ahead as we await word if schools are going to reopen. Even if they do not, we must continue to promote everything we can. The word of mouth network can be especially useful in times like this. That also includes social media. Soon, we will be announcing an aggressive social media platform to help accomplish our mission. So, look for great things to come from our programs.

For our All State Program this year, we are keeping a very aggressive stance when it comes to the competition. All State is supposed to highlight those Posts and Districts who have gone above and beyond the call of duty to exemplify everything the VFW stands for. That is why the rules for the competition are going to be as tough as they are. However, to get the ball rolling, within the next few days, all Post and Districts that have an email address will begin to receive the All State Checklists. Most District Commanders already have them, so if you do not receive them via email, they can get a copy to you. I know it is going to be tough to meet the requirements, but we would not have set them that way if we did not think that you could do it.

Our Department Centennial is April 16th, 2021. By this point, all of you should have received a card in the mail asking you to update your information and submit your picture and story to be added to our Centennial Memory book. I hope all of you have participated and have purchased a book. It is a great memento to have. Not many get to celebrate 100 years, so this is going to be an amazing experience for all of us. Speaking of mementos, our Centennial Coin design was released at the State Convention. District 1 Commander Matt Ward had the winning design. The coins are currently being made and will be available at the upcoming district meetings as well as the Schools of Instruct August 15th in Eufaula and August 22nd at the State Headquarters. All the State Officers and District Commanders have preorder forms. They are two inches wide and the price per coin is \$20. Each coin will be individually numbered and current set is 500 coins. We would love to have

to order another 500! So, get in contact with one of the state officers to reserve yours today!



Finally, again I want to thank all of you for elevating me to this high office. As I said before, this year is about you and TEAM OKLAHOMA. OUR MISSION: The Oklahoma VFW Foundation, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, assists Oklahoma veterans and their families, promotes patriotic programs, provides relief for veterans and veteran support organizations, and provides educational scholarships.

First of all, the Oklahoma VFW Foundation wants to thank everyone who has participated in our Founding Donor and Founding Sponsor programs. Our Founding Sponsors are listed on the home page of our website (www.okvfwfoundation.org) and the Founding Donors are listed on a different page of that website. Please review those lists and thank those individuals and organizations for their support.

The Foundation wishes to welcome two new board members. Jeremy Owens, who by being elected as the new Junior Vice Commander for the Department of Oklahoma VFW will also serve on the Board of Directors. The five members of the Board who are elected by the VFW membership also selected John Payne of VFW Post 20207 to serve a 4-year term on the board of directors. The Foundation would like to offer its sincere thanks to the two board members who dropped off of the board, who have been members of the board from the beginning, Darryl Mabry and Ron Slowik.

Current other items that the Board of the Foundation approved, and that the Foundation is working on include:

- In July 2020, the Foundation will be making a \$5,000 donation to the Oklahoma VFW to help fund their Veteran Service Officer program.
- The Foundation will be working to obtain corporate sponsors to fund the Voice of Democracy and Patriots Pen cash awards.
- The Foundation will be awarding the following donations to Honor Guards that have reported their activity to the Oklahoma VFW: \$2,000 to the District 5 Honor Guard, \$700 to the Del City VFW Post 9969 Honor Guard, \$700 to the Blanchard Veterans Honor Guard and \$700 to the VFW Post 1317 Shawnee Honor Guard. Executive Director Fischer will be contacting these Honor Guard's in the next few weeks to coordinate a formal presentation of these awards.
- The Foundation approved a disaster assistance program for Posts allowing for 50/50 matching grants up to \$1,000 for the purchase of materials to repair Post home buildings damaged by natural disasters.

- The Foundation is working with the Warriors for Freedom foundation in being a sponsor of their golf outing at Winter Creek Golf Course on July 18th.

As a reminder, you can be one of our Founding Donors for a donation of \$100. Founding Donors will receive a limited-edition pin and a numbered certificate, there will only be 200 founding donors.
