

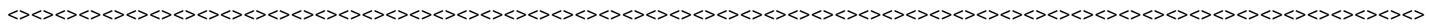

General Orders No. 07

2021-2022 Series

1. Attention is directed to Section 213 of the National Bylaws concerning any Post in arrears for any financial obligations to County Council (if applicable), District, Department and National for fees, dues, poppy money, supply money, failing to have the office of Quartermaster properly bonded in accordance with Section 703, failing to ensure that the Post is properly insured in accordance with Section 709, failing to submit properly completed quarterly Post Trustees Report of Audit, Post Election Report for the ensuing year, or other obligations, shall be deprived of all representation in County Council and District meetings; County Council, District, Department and National Conventions. Such representation shall be restored promptly upon proper adjustment of such deficiencies. The attention of District and Post Commanders is directed to Section 103 of the Manual of Procedures, which prescribes the manner in which applications for membership will be handled. Applications for membership of new, reinstated or transfer members must be voted on by the members present at a regular Post meeting.

2. Commanders on all levels are reminded that according to Section 105 of the National Bylaws, a member whose dues are unpaid after their anniversary date ceases to be a member in good standing and loses all rights of membership in the Veterans of Foreign Wars. They shall not attend meetings or conventions and shall not participate in Post, County Council, District, Department or National functions.

3. Notice to Commanders and Adjutants: All Voice of Democracy, Patriot Pen, and Teacher of the Year Reports MUST be submitted via the All-American Dashboard. Post Adjutants must enter their Posts' report. District Adjutants must approve Post Reports and enter the District Report. Contact Department Adjutant Curt Watts for information and/or questions.

4. Notice to All: I wanted to make sure you are aware that News 9 is giving away a complete HVAC system to a veteran in need. A worthy veteran can be nominated at the following link: news9.com/veteran.

5. Department Directory/Roster: Department Directory has been updated to reflect new State Officers. The updated directory can be found in the “members only” section of the Department website at vfwhqoklahoma@outlook.com

6. Trustee’s Report of Audit: Attention of Post Commanders is directed to Section 218 of the Manual of Procedure, “Duty of Trustees.” Trustees Report of Audit must be completed in detail at the close of each quarter, one of which ends Dec 31 2021. Commanders are reminded that accurate and complete records shall be kept by all person handling Post funds, including the Club Manager, Bingo Chairman and VFW Riders Groups. These records shall be audited by Post Trustees in the same manner as Post Quartermaster and Adjutant.

Posts & Districts are reminded to forward their Trustees’ reports at the end of each quarter of the current year: June 30th, Sep 30th, Dec 31st and March 31st. Send these audit reports to VFW-OK, P.O. Box 1126, Oklahoma City, OK 73101 or email to vfwhqokqm@outlook.com

7. Commanders at all levels should begin organizing their 2022 Memorial Day “Buddy Poppy Campaign. Every Post is urged to order and distribute VFW “Buddy” Poppies.

8. Proof of Eligibility Requirements for Officers: All Posts, Districts and Departments should be reminded of the provisions of Sections 216, 416, and 516 of the Manual of Procedure that officers, elected and appointed, shall not be installed or assume the duties of their office until proof of eligibility has been submitted to the respective Adjutant and properly reviewed.

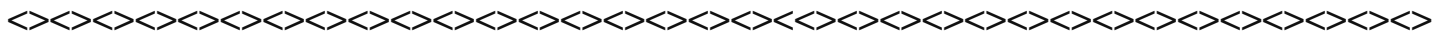

Comrades, I hope all of you had a peaceful and blessed holiday season filled with joy, laughter, and fun with family and friends. While we use the Holiday Season to always count our blessing and remember those less fortunate than us, we can also use it as a time to reflect on the past while building on the future with renewed resolutions, promises, and determination. As your National Council Member, it is my goal and desire to always represent you, speak out for you, and do what we believe is best for the VFW Department of Oklahoma within our National organization.

I wanted to inform you of a few things on the National level.

Teacher of the Year Program & Recognition at the National Convention:

At our National Convention, the VFW has traditionally honored three teachers, one from each category. The Teacher of the Year Program has, three categories, Kindergarten thru 5th grade, sixth thru eighth grade, and ninth thru twelfth grade. Departments throughout the organization submit an entry for each category if they so desire, then a winner from each category would receive a trip to our national convention and thereby be recognized with money for themselves and their school. However, this year, only one teacher among all three categories will be recognized. Departments are required to send only one teacher's packet forward for the "VFW Teacher of the Year" to meet the requirement for All-American. While all understand the All-American Program and its requirements belong to the Commander-in-Chief, VFW programs belong to the membership.

Therefore, National Council Member Larry Gerlt from Nebraska is pushing to have all three categories recognized at future National Conventions with each winner receiving \$2,000, \$1,000 for themselves, and \$1,000 for their school plus compensation for their travel to the National Convention. I support Comrade Gerlt's proposal to recognize a teacher from all three categories and push that funding for this program's additional cost be added to our national budget. Additionally, I have asked you and other members within our department your thoughts and so far, responses have been positive to the suggestion as described above. However, as your representative, I will support and vote how our department membership desires. I will seek further opinions from our membership during our Mid-Winter Conference before any vote by the National Council of Administration is conducted.

Quartermaster General Debra Anderson has provided a final draft of the National VFW's IRS 990 to the Council of Administration. If you are interested in receiving a copy of the VFW's IRS 990 for FY 2020, please let me know and I will forward it to you.

Quartermaster General Debra Anderson has provided a copy of the first quarter operations for the VFW 21-22 Fiscal year. She stated that "while fiscal Year 2020-21 provided stellar market returns, there has been more volatility, and some pull back in the market to start this fiscal year. Our General Fund Reserve investment ended the first quarter with market losses of just under \$1.5 million, and so far, December has provided more losses. We continue to meet with our investment consultants and managers and follow our investment policy statements to help minimize the overall risk to our portfolios." She also stated that "Through the first quarter, most operations appear to be on track with the budget, but there are a couple of larger items that will have an overall impact on the operating results for the year.

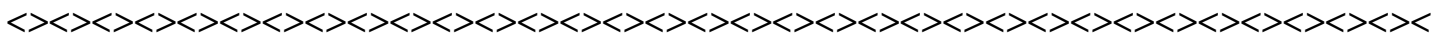
1.) **Salary & Benefits** The VFW has continued to review staffing and has consolidated or eliminated positions when possible. The VFW has gone from 216 budgeted positions in 2019-20 to 202 budgeted positions for 2021-22. In addition, there have been several

VMS Programs are an integral part of the VFW's never-ending obligation to assist members of the active-duty military, national Guard and Reserves, as well as their families. VMS is broken down into 3 distinct stand-alone programs.



- Unmet Needs
- Military Assistance Program (MAP)
- VFW "Sport Clips Help a Hero Scholarship" program

- * Unmet Needs provides financial assistance to service members, veterans, and their families experiencing a financial hardship directly related to their military service.
- * Assistance, not a handout.
- * The financial assistance is in the form of a one-time grant in an amount up to \$2,500. All grants are paid directly to the “creditor” companies (such as the electric company, mortgage company, landlord, etc.) and not to the individual.
- * Funds can be used for rent, car repairs, medical expenses, infant-care items and many other necessities.
- * Each case is reviewed individually, and acceptance determined by a committee.

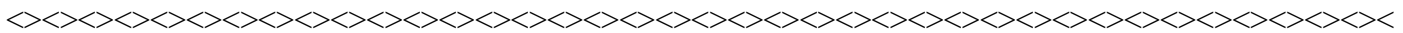

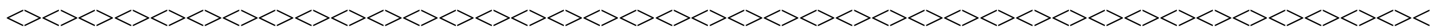

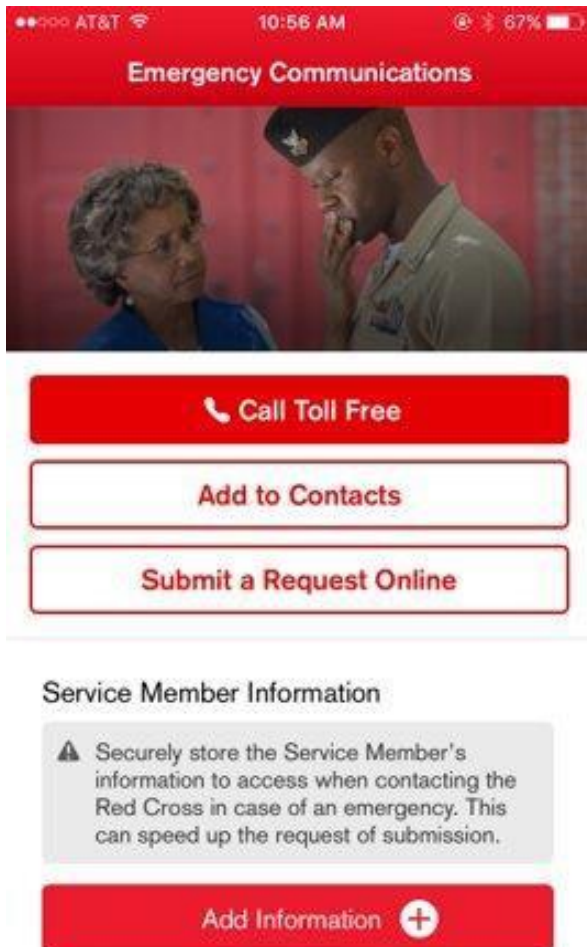
