





Hello Comrades,

VMS Programs are an integral part of the VFW's never-ending obligation to assist members of the active-duty military, national guard and reserves, as well as their families. VMS is broken down into 3 distinct stand-alone programs.

- Unmet Needs
- Military Assistance Program (MAP)
- VFW "Sport Clips Help a Hero Scholarship" program



This year the focus is on Unmet Needs.

This year's years fair was a great success thanks to those who gave up their time to serve. Posts from around the state stepped up and supported the effort. The participating Posts signed up several life members and annual members, spoke with numerous Veterans about their needs and directed them to the appropriate entity and collected \$468.50 for VMS Programs. This was only the second year that we have been involved with the fair and each time we gain more experience on how to make it better next year. We are already looking for someone to be the State Fair Chairperson of next year. If you want to serve, this is a great way to do it.

Last month we had the opportunity to participate in the First Annual USO Experience "Military Village." This event drew all of the US Military Branches to RiverSport Park. Again we set up a table/tent and had the opportunity to speak with Active Duty, Guard and Reserve personnel.

There will be opportunities arising during the upcoming Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons. The Air Guard has already reached out to us for assistance with food baskets. We will have more information on this later.

- * Unmet Needs provides financial assistance to service members, veterans, and their families experiencing a financial hardship directly related to their military service.
- * Assistance, not a hand out.
- * The financial assistance is in the form of a one-time grant in an amount up to \$5,000. All grants are paid directly to the "creditor" companies (such as the electric company, mortgage company, landlord, etc.) and not to the individual.
- * Funds can be used for rent, car repairs, medical expenses, infant-care items and many other necessities.
- * Each case is reviewed individually, and acceptance determined by a committee.


